My son, Julian Roberts, has been in with Little Peoples Place (Infant and Toddlers Program) since the age of 3 months old. I believe that overall his experience has been a positive one.

He has developed his social skills at a very young age, which I think is very important. His interaction with others, both in and outside his age group, is well advanced and a joy to watch. I am satisfied with the level of care given by the providers. The best way for me to tell if Julian is truly happy is the way he acts with them. Julian just adores them and I definitely see it reciprocated. It is like they take a personal interest in Julian's development where they have grown to love him like their own, but clearly understands who the parent is and do not overstep their boundaries. I especially like that the children are provided with healthy meals. Also, LLP has a lot of activities and field trips to keep the children happy and stimulated.

On the flip side, Julian is almost 2 years old (22 months) and I believe that he should be talking more, or at least saying more words than he does now. While that blame cannot be placed totally on LLP, I would like to see more learning in the Infant and Toddler program. I know that once children reach 2 years old, they leave this program and are placed in the school where there is a more structured learning environment; however, it is never too early to learn. It must also be taken into consideration that children learn at different paces.

The level of care, the affordable tuition, and convenience of LLP has made being a young, working mother a lot easier. I also have peace of mind knowing that when I drop him off in the mornings, he is safe and well taken care of. I would definitely recommend LLP to other parents.
